Year Three Resources and Capacity Peer-Evaluation Report Spring 2012 Eastern Washington University Recommendation

1. Eastern Washington University has made significant progress in defining mission fulfillment. Each of its institutional indicators now has a benchmark. However, mission fulfillment is defined in terms of fulfillment of *objectives*. The peer evaluation committee is uncertain precisely how the institution proposes to use the achievement or non-achievement of benchmarks for *indicators* to determine the ratings of *objectives*. The committee recommends that EWU further clarify how performance on indicators determines mission fulfillment. The committee is also concerned that the weighting of each objective equally does not necessarily reflect the purpose and mission of the institution. The committee recommends that EWU consider how, or to what degree, each of the objectives relates to institutional purpose.
