

Public Safety Advisory – Recent Drug Overdoses 4/25/2017

The Eastern Washington University Police Department is aware of recent increased drug use and overdose incidents on campus. We would like to warn the campus community about the dangers of using drugs such as psilocybin (mushrooms), acid (LSD), and other synthetic drugs. There are a number of synthetic drugs on the market, including synthetic marijuana (Spice or K2), synthetic stimulants (Bath Salts) and a drug known as N-bomb. The active ingredients in these drugs are synthetic chemicals with dangerous toxic effects. Users have no idea what chemicals they are putting into their bodies or what the effects will be, and the potency can be inconsistent.

People who have ingested these drugs may experience the following affects.

- Rapid heart rate
- Increased blood pressure
- Vomiting
- Impaired judgment
- Mood alterations
- Confusion
- Aggression
- Paranoia
- Extreme anxiety
- Hallucinations
- Psychotic behavior
